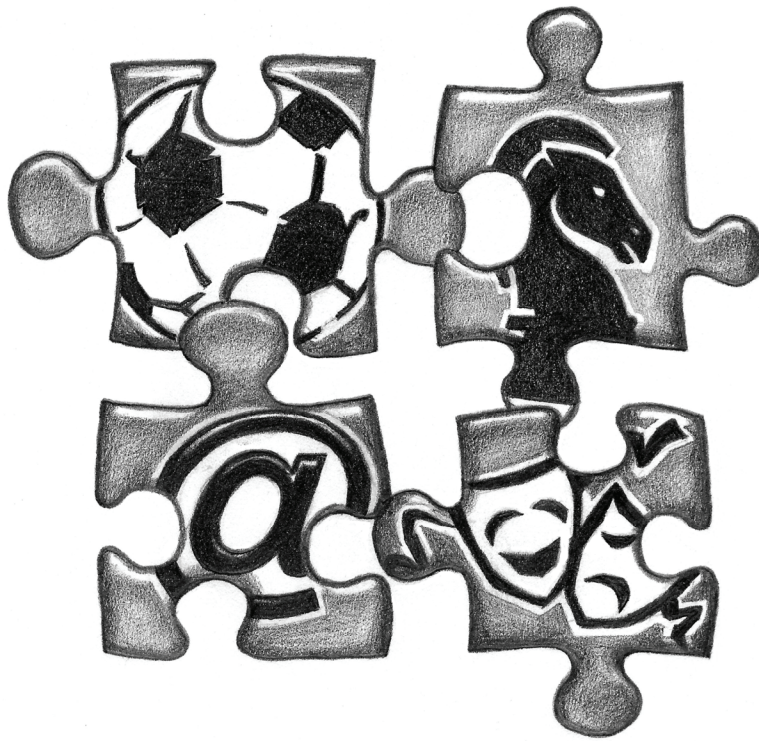

## **After-School Program (Nursery to 6<sup>th</sup> Grade)**

Our after-school program for the lower division (N-6) runs weekdays from 3:00-6:00 p.m. and includes snack time, homework help, indoor/outdoor play, organized games, crafts, clubs and special events. The program structure is flexible, so you can arrange an after-school plan that meets your family's needs.



## **7<sup>th</sup> - and 8<sup>th</sup> -Grade**

Garden School has a program for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. The After-School Program operates every school day from 3:00-6:00 p.m. to offer homework support and structured activities, including cards, board games, support for sports teams, and free play in the gym or field.

Students who choose to remain at school after 3:00 p.m. and who are not in extra help with a teacher, in a club, on a team, or attending a Foundations course are automatically enrolled in the After-School Program and billed at the daily rate.

## **After-School Program Rates**

### **Per Hour/Day Rates:**

- Until 4:00 p.m.: \$12
- Until 5:00 p.m.: \$18
- Until 6:00 p.m.: \$25

Programs end at 6:00 p.m. In the event of an emergency, please call the school. Pick-ups after 6:00 p.m. will result in an additional charge of \$10/half hour.

### **Full-Year Discount Rates:**

- Until 4:00 p.m. for the year: \$1,700
- Until 5:00 p.m. for the year: \$2,200
- Until 6:00 p.m. for the year: \$2,800

Timely payments are required to qualify for the full-year discount rates. These rates are per family—they are the same regardless of the number of children a family has enrolled in the program.

Students enrolled full time for the After-School Program receive a discount on Foundations classes, paying \$180 for the first course and \$130 for each additional course

All Foundations classes are subject to change due to a teacher's absence. If your child's class is cancelled, he or she may attend After-School until pick-up. There will be no charge for the time your child would have been in the lesson.

- In the interest of safety and security, all students in grade 8 and lower must attend After-School if they are not in a club, class, lesson, sports team, or extra help or tutoring session. All children on campus must be supervised.
- If your child is being picked up by someone other than a known parent/guardian, please bring a note to school or contact Ms. James, the After-School Coordinator. This includes family members and parents of your child's friends.
- All parents/guardians must sign the student out in the After-School book. Students are not permitted to wait outside.
- All Foundations classes are subject to cancellation if they do not receive minimum enrollment.
- Any student who is deemed by the teacher or the After-School Coordinator to be a disturbance in a Foundations class will be asked to leave the class and refunds will not be given.

## About Foundations

Garden School's specialty classes are geared toward the varied interests of our students and the high standards of our parent/guardian community. Foundation classes broaden students' awareness and bring forth their skills and talents in a nurturing environment.

Unless otherwise noted in the description, classes are 1 hour long, run for 12 weeks, and start the week of February 6.

We recommend students bring a snack for the period between the end of school and the beginning of the class.

Foundations classes are **\$200 for the first course and \$150 for each additional course**, or if enrolled full-time in the After-School Program, \$180 for the first course and \$130 for each additional course.



## Foundations Spring 2012 Offerings

### **Acrobatics** (max. 10 students)

Build strength and flexibility through exercises, learn basic tumbling and gymnastics, and put all that together with dance to create an acrobatics routine you'll want to break into every chance you get.

**Group A**, Grades: PK-1 Day: Mon. 3:00 p.m.

**Group B**, Grades: PK-1 Day: Tue. 3:00 p.m.

### **Ballet** (max. 10 students)

The perfect start for aspiring dancers! We'll begin with the 5 basic ballet positions and practice the techniques of classical ballet. We'll also learn the names of each movement and weave them together to create a beautiful ballet.



**Group A**, Grades: PK-1 Day: Thur. 3:00 p.m.

**Group B**, Grades: PK-1 Day: Fri. 3:00 p.m.

**Instructor:** Miss. Kim has been dancing for more than 24 years and teaching students of all ages for more than 14 years. She is trained in ballet, jazz, tap, modern, hip-hop, and acrobatics.

## **Chess Educators**

There is a significant body of research that shows the effect of chess on brain development. Students can apply chess to problem-solving skills.

In addition, chess is an academic performance booster as well as a universal “language” for people from different backgrounds – it is a perfect After-School pursuit for Garden School students! All level students are welcome.

**Note:** The level the student is in is determined by age and experience. Students may be evaluated and moved to the class level that best suits their ability.

### **Chess Level: Level 1 & 2 Introduction &**

#### **Advanced Novice** (max. 12 students)

This course is designed to introduce kindergarten and first grade students to chess. The students will learn about the chessboard, pieces, basic rules, special moves, introduction to tactics, strategy, & notation. The teaching method involves a hands-on



approach in which the children learn by playing games, and solving chess puzzles. The children will be exposed to pattern recognition and spatial problem solving that help develop abstract thinking. This class will be both very entertaining and educational for the children, and will help nurture good sportsmanship and social skills.

**Level: 1 & 2 Introduction & Advanced Novice**

## **Chess Level: Level 3 & 4 Intermediate &**

**Advanced** (max. 12 students)

This course is designed for intermediate and advanced chess players who are already familiar with the fundamentals of chess.

The students will learn about tactics, openings principles, middle-game and end game strategy, introduction to chess tournament play, rules related to advanced play.

The teaching method involves a hands-on approach in which the students learn by playing games, and solving advanced chess puzzles. The students will be exposed to the tournament play experience necessary to engage in competitions.

This class will be both entertaining and educational for the students, and will help nurture good sportsmanship, social skills, help the students gain insight into the nature of competition and learn from both winning and losing through the analysis of one's games.

**Level: 3 & 4 Intermediate & Advanced**

**Day:** Tues. 3:30 p.m.

**Instructor:** Beatriz Marinello. WIM (Woman International Master) and United States Chess Federation Life Master Beatriz Marinello moved to the United States from her native Chile in 1990.

In 2003, Ms. Marinello was elected U.S. Chess Federation's (USCF) President, which is the first and only time a woman has ever served in that capacity. She has established and runs numerous scholastic chess programs in New York City. Ms. Marinello has also served as the USCF National Scholastic Director.

## Digital Architecture Design (max 10 students)

## Greek 101 (max. 12 students)

Geography, octagon, gymnasium. Just a few words in our everyday vocabulary that come from the Greek language. Opa! Mastering Greek will open up new linguistic avenues for students. Scholars who enroll in our Greek Language classes will become familiar with the Greek alphabet and vocabulary. They will be able to utilize fundamental phrases and expressions in beginning conversation, and read basic modern Greek on an elementary level. The real benefit will be that these young minds will have tools to decode vocabulary words and apply the grammar skills they learn in Greek to their future scholarly pursuits!

## **Growing Chefs: Organic Cooking and Gardening**



(max. 15 students)

Learn to cook your favorite foods and help wake-up our schoolyard garden! In this 10-week workshop with the culinary experts from Growing Chefs, kids will explore the fun behind rolling homemade dough, inventing sauces and using fresh, healthy ingredients in familiar, yummy recipes like pasta, pizza, pretzels and ice pops. We will also be working in our garden with seeds and young plants in preparation for the Spring. Every lesson ends with a snack, and the program ends with a cookbook of your very own.

## **Hip Hop** (max. 15 students)

Garden’s Ms. Kim, brings us “soul” with Hip Hop. For children who have had some dance experience, Hip Hop will explore some cool moves. The class will focus on isolation of movements while moving different body parts concurrently, but in different ways. Great exercise, fun, fun, fun and a fantastic way to use all of that energy!

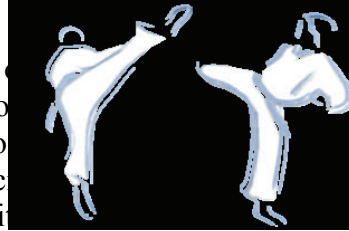
**Grades:** 4–6 **Day:** Tues. 3:30 p.m.

**Instructors:** Gabriel Gomis and Stella Stenos. Mr. Gomis teaches French, African Literature, and coaches co-ed middle school soccer at Garden School. Ms. Stenos teaches Language Arts and Social Studies, is the Dean of grades 4-6, and is the assistant coach for co-ed middle school soccer at Garden School.

**Tae Kwon Do** (max. 10 students)

This course is a favorite. “The way of the hand and the foot” is not only for self-defense and exercise but is also for learning focus, self-control, discipline, and manners. Classes start with warm-ups and stretches and then move into kicking, blocking, and learning the forms—choreographed movements that help us practice our skills. Classes finish with a game and meditation.

**About Skill Levels:** All grade ranges for dance classes are only suggested grades, as skill level really determines which class any student should take. At the time of registration, Miss Kim will confirm all students’ appropriate class levels for both new students and returning dancers. If a change is required or recommended, she will notify you immediately to suggest the best placement for your child.

**Visitors Week for the Dance Program:** The last week of every month is Visitors Week in Dance. Please join us to learn what we’re working on! In addition to giving you a glimpse of the class, this will help prepare the children for our Annual Spring Dance Recital.



**Note on Attire:** Leotards with tights for girls and leotards or a tight shirt with stretch pants for boys are suggested for all dance classes. Children should have jazz oxfords or booties for acrobatics or ballet shoes for ballet. If you have any questions about where to buy dance clothing or shoes, please contact Ms. James. Miss Kim will purchase costumes as the recital nears at the cost of \$35 per class.



## Garden School Music Conservatory

The Music Conservatory is an ideal way for your child to discover an instrument of choice that suits his or her own unique talents. Our music teacher, Tom Heineman, assisted by professional musicians, provides individual instruction for students in Garden School's upper and lower divisions.

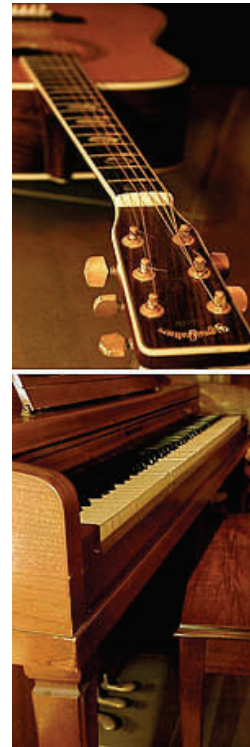
- Private piano instruction for K and up—30-minute lessons, 25 weeks at \$550.

- Other private instruction for grades 3 and up—45-minute lessons, 25 weeks at \$625.

Each lesson involves music technique, sheet music reading, and learning and practicing songs. At-home practice is necessary. Please note that it is the responsibility of each student to attend his or her scheduled lesson. Missed lessons cannot be made up. In the event of a teacher's absence, parents and students will be notified immediately and an experienced substitute will fill in for the lesson. Any class that cannot be scheduled in this way will be added to the end of the lesson period.

### After-School Academic Skills Building Club

Once a week from 3:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m., Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth graders have the opportunity to join an exciting new club at the school. Students will embark on different team and skills building challenges across the curriculum in an effort to expand their social, critical thinking, and subject area skills. Each academic quarter will reflect a different area of curriculum in regard to the team and skills building activities. For example, if, during the second quarter, the club's focus is Language Arts and Social Studies, a weekly activity would reflect this through an organized team challenge, such as constructing the United States after collaboratively finding the necessary pieces to do so. While working together, students will gain experience making decisions with others of different ages, backgrounds, interests, and abilities, hence, further developing the aforementioned skills.

## Garden School Teams

### **FLL: LEGO® MINDSTORMS Robotics**

(max 14 students)

Garden School “Roboneers” have already won a design award in the FIRST® LEGO® League (FLL) challenge. Can FIRST® LEGO® League Teams Improve Food Safety? In the 2011 Food Factor Challenge, over 200,000 9-16 year olds from over 55 countries will explore the topic of food safety and examine the possible points of contamination our food encounters – from exposure to insects and creatures, to unsterile processing and transportation, to unsanitary preparation and storage– then find ways to prevent or combat these contaminants. Students will be interviewed by Roboneer leaders to qualify for the team.

### **Garden School Debate Team**

This team is a forensics organization whose purpose is to stimulate growth through participation in interscholastic debate and individual speaking activities. Debate not only develops skills such as research, logic and reasoning but interpersonal skills as well. The team will travel to schools and select tournaments. A serious commitment is required on the part of team members who will be selected after an interview process in September.

## **Journalism—Who? What? Where?**

This exciting course will cover journalism basics including market research, editing, writing and reporting. To create the new publication, students will take inventory of the available resources and talent pool, conduct both market and editorial research, and produce a launch edition of the new publication. Students will discover what their market is (school community, Jackson Heights community, Queens Teens, etc.), what medium would be used, frequency of publication, financing, and pricing vs. free distribution.

**Instructor:** **Victoria Zunitch.** Ms. Zunitch is a Garden School Parent, a graduate of Columbia University's School of Journalism, and has worked as a journalist for 14 years.

## **Project Green**



Project Green involves students working in collaboration with their peers to develop structures which use renewable sources of energy. Students will be introduced to many different types of alternative energy sources such as solar, wind, hydro, nuclear and biomass. The students will research and investigate the efficiency of the different energy sources and what structures and designs are the best to use. They will then use computer design to create a blueprint of different structures that will be assembled. They will modify their blueprints to accommodate these requirements. The final stage will be the building of the structures themselves.

To support the students' learning, we will be going to the Hall of Science for some after-school workshops.
