- 1. Topic Sentence
 - a. Answers the topic/question and presents your main idea
- 2. Context
 - a. 2-3 sentences that give the reader relevant background information
- 3. Evidence
 - a. Provides a quote from the text to prove your idea
 - b. May include a **brief** summary (2-3 sentences) of an important event
- 4. Evaluate the quote
 - a. Explain why the quote you used is important
 - b. What does the quote prove about your topic?
- 5. Closing sentence
 - a. Summarize your main idea without repeating your topic sentence
